

Two simple blocks, a Ribbon Star block and a Snowball block, create this easy quilt.

#### Cutting - All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF)

#### **BEJE 542G**

- Cut (3) 3 1/2" x WOF strips; sub-cut into (30) 3 1/2" squares
- Cut (2) 4" x WOF strips; sub-cut into (15) 4" squares
- Cut (6) 1 1/2" x WOF strips for border 1\*
- Cut (7) 2 1/4" x WOF strips for binding\*

#### **BEJE 542E**

- Cut (3) 3 1/2" x WOF strips; sub-cut into (30) 3 1/2" squares
- Cut (2) 4" x WOF strips; sub-cut into (15) 4" squares

#### **BEJE 543E**

• Cut (3) 4" x WOF strips; sub-cut into (30) 4" squares

#### BEJE 542R

• Cut (6) 4" x WOF strips; sub-cut into (60) 4" squares

#### **BEJE 545E**

• Cut (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip; sub-cut into (6) 3 1/2" squares

#### **BEIE 545G**

• Cut (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip; sub-cut into (9) 3 1/2" squares

#### BEIE 541R

• Cut (2) 9 1/2" x WOF strips; sub-cut into (7) 9 1/2" squares\*\*

#### **BEJE 541E**

• Cut (2) 9 1/2" x WOF strips; sub-cut into (8) 9 1/2" squares \*\*

#### BEJE 544R

• Cut (6) 5" x WOF strips for border 2





### Construction ~ Please read all instructions before beginning

Sew all seams using a 1/4"-wide seam allowance. HST refers to half-square triangles.

#### **BLOCK CONSTRUCTION**

#### BLOCK A: Ribbon Star - Make six A1 and nine A2

 ${f 1.}$  Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each 542R 4" square. (See fig. 1)

**Note:** Instead of drawing a line on the wrong side of the BEJE 542R 4" squares, you can cut the squares diagonally into triangles, and then sew with 1/4"-wide seam allowance and trim to make a 3 1/2" square.

- **2.** Place the following 4" squares, right sides together, sew <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" from each side of the marked line and cut apart on line to make the following HST pairs: (60) 543E and 542R; (30) 542R and 542E; (30) 542R and 542G. Trim all HSTs to 3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" square. Press all seam allowances toward the red. (See fig. 2)
- **3.** Block A1: Arrange four 543E/542R, two 542R/542G, two 542R/542E, and one 545E 4" square according to the illustration. Make six. Press in direction of the arrows. (See fig. 3)
- **4.** Block A2: Arrange HST as in step three, substituting one 545G 4" square. Make nine. (See fig. 3)

#### BLOCK B: Snowball - Make eight B1 and seven B2

- **5.** Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each 542G and 542E 3 ½" squares.
- **6.** Block B1: Place two 542G 3 ½" squares right sides together, on opposite corners of a 541E 9 ½" squares. Sew along the drawn line. Press triangle towards the corner and trim the excess fabric, leaving a ¼"-wide seam allowance. *Hint: Sew to the inside of the line, towards the corner (a thread's width) instead of directly on the line.* Repeat with two 542E 3 ½" squares to the other two corners. Make eight. (See fig. 4)
- **7.** Block B2: Repeat step six using the 541R 9 ½" squares. Make seven. (See fig. 4)

#### **QUILT CONSTRUCTION**

- **8.** Using the photo as a reference, arrange in six rows of five blocks each. For row 1, start and end with a B1 block, alternating the A1 and B2 blocks as shown. (Make sure all A blocks face the same direction with 542G on the top left corner. All B blocks have 542G in the top right corner for all rows). Sew the blocks together and press toward the B blocks. Repeat for row five.
- **9.** Row 2, start with an A2 block, alternating with a B1 block first and then a B2 block. Sew together and press toward the B blocks. Repeat for row six.
- **10.** Row 3, start with a B2 block, alternating A1 and B2 blocks. Sew together and press toward the B blocks.
- **11.** Row 4, start with an A2 block, alternating with a B2 block first and then a B1 block. Sew together and press toward the B blocks.
- **12.** Sew the rows together and press the seam allowances in one direction.

#### **BORDER CONSTRUCTION**

- **13.** Border 1: Sew the six 1 ½"-wide 542*G* strips together end to end with a diagonal seams. Measure through vertical center (up and down) of quilt and trim two strips to that length. Sew to the sides of the quilt top. Measure through horizontal center (side to side) and from the remaining strip trim two strips to that length. Sew to top and bottom of the quilt top. Press toward border strips.
- **14.** Sew the six 544R strips together end to end with straight seams (with horizontal stripes this is better). Repeat step 13 for sides and top and bottom borders.
- **15.** Layer the quilt top, batting, and pieced back; baste and quilt as desired. Bind using the seven 2 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>"-wide 542G strips. Put a label on the back and enjoy your new quilt!
