PLEASE READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE BEGINNING

Ouilt size: 38" x 50"

General instructions

- * All seams are sewn with 1/4".
- * Press in the direction of the arrows unless instructed otherwise.
- * HST refers to Half-square triangle, a square that has been cut once diagonally.
- *QST refers to Quarter-square triangle, a square that has been cut twice diagonally.
- *I do not recommend washing the panel.
- *Make a template 3-3/8" x 3-3/8". Draw two diagonal lines through both corners.

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS (based on 42" wide)

From Fabric 1

*Trim the panel to 23" wide. Tip: Fold panel in half vertically, through the center of the tree, and measure 11-1/2" from the center, to trim both sides evenly.


*Trim the length of the panel to 35". First cut straight across at 3/4" above the top of the tree. Measure down 35" and cut straight across.

From Fabric 2

*Using the 3-3/8" square template, center the diagonal lines along the centers of the small star in the fabric. Cut twelve on-point. (see illustration) If using a regular print cut twelve 3-3/8" squares.



*Using a square ruler, cut four 4-1/2" x 4-1/2", (straight on) placing the 2-1/4" lines along the center of the star. Trim two sides, turn ruler and trim other two sides. (see illustration) Cut four 4-1/2" squares if using a regular print.



From Fabric 3

*Cut two 3-3/8" x WOF strips; sub-cut into eighteen 3-3/8" x 3-3/8".

*Cut five 2-1/4" x WOF for binding.

From Fabric 4

*Cut three 1-7/8" x WOF strips; sub-cut into fifty-two 1-7/8" x 1-7/8".

From Fabric 5

*Cut two 3-1/4" x WOF strips; sub-cut into thirteen 3-1/4" x 3-1/4" then cut each twice diagonally to make fifty-two QST.

*Cut two 2-7/8" x 2-7/8"; cut each once diagonally to make four HST.

*Cut four 1-1/4" x WOF.

From Fabric 6

*Cut two 3-1/4" x WOF strips; sub-cut into thirteen 3-1/4" x 3-1/4" then cut each twice diagonally to make fifty-two QST.

*Cut two 2-7/8" x 2-7/8"; cut each once diagonally to make four HST.

Cut five 3-1/2" x WOF strips for border.

PIECED BORDER CONSTRUCTION

1. Sew a 3-1/4" Fabric 5
QST to two sides of a 1-7/8"
Fabric 4 square. Make 26.

Repeat with the 3-1/4"
Fabric 6 QST. Make 26.

2. Sew a 2-7/8" Fabric 6 HST to the right side of a 3-3/8" Fabric 3 square and a 2-7/8" Fabric 5 HST to the left side. Make 4.

3. Repeat step 2 except sew Fabric 5 to the right side and Fabric 6 to the left. Make 4.

4. Sew a Triangle Unit 1 on the top left side of unit A. Make 4.




5. Sew a Triangle Unit 2 to the bottom right side of Unit B. Make 4.

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6. Sew a Triangle Unit 1 to the top left side of a 3-3/8" Fabric 3 square and a Triangle Unit 2 to the bottom right. Make



7. Sew a Triangle Unit 1 to the top left side of a 3-3/8" Fabric 2 square and a Triangle Unit 2 to the bottom right. Make 12.



8. Starting with Unit A1, matching seams, sew a Unit D, then Unit C. Continue alternating D and C, as illustrated, ending with a Unit B1. Make 2. (Side borders) These should equal 4-1/2" x 36-1/2". Press all seams in one direction.

9. Starting with Unit A1, matching seams, sew Unit D, then two Unit C, then Unit D as illustrated, ending with a Unit B1. Make 2. B1 (Top and bottom borders)

These should equal 4-1/2" x 24-1/2". Press all seams in one direction.




QUILT CONSTRUCTION

(See illustration)

10. Trim two 1-1/4" Fabric 5 strips to 35" in length. Sew to sides of Fabric 1 panel. Trim the remaining two strips to 24-1/2". Sew to top and bottom. Press to Fabric 5.

- 12. Matching centers and ends, sew on side pieced borders units. Press to Fabric 5 strips.
- 13. Sew a 4-1/2" Fabric 2 square to both ends of the top and bottom pieced border units. Press to squares. Matching centers and ends, sew to top and bottom. Press to Fabric 5 strips.
- 14. Sew three 3-1/2" Fabric 6 strips short ends together with diagonal seams. Trim to two 44-1/2" lengths. Matching centers and ends, sew to sides. Press to Fabric 6.
- 15. Trim two 3-1/2" Fabric 6 strips to 38-1/2". Matching centers and ends sew to top and bottom. Press to Fabric 6.



FINISHING

- 16. Layer top, batting, and pieced backing and quilt as desired.
- 17. Sew the five 2-1/4" Fabric 3 binding strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Sew to the quilt using a French binding technique. **PUT A LABEL ON THE BACK AND ENJOY!**
